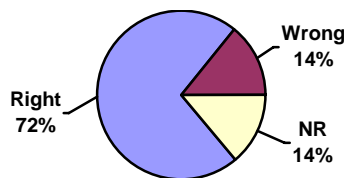
Telecom Deals; Views about Night Time Specials: GILANI POLL/GALLUP PAKISTAN

Islamabad, March 3, 2010

According to a Gilani Research Foundation survey carried out by Gallup Pakistan, majority of all Pakistanis appeared to be against the special night time packages which the telecom companies provide to the customers; 72% support the Punjab assembly's resolution for putting restriction on such packages, 14% oppose the resolution and 14% gave no response. When asked whether these night time packages created negative impact on the youth, 74% claimed to agree, 10% disagree with this notion and 16% were unsure. The findings of the data reveal no significant difference in opinion of people from across various demographics.

A nationally representative sample of men and women from across the country were asked "*Recently in Punjab assembly a resolution was passed and accepted to cancel all the night time packages of all telecom companies. Do you think Punjab assembly has done the right thing or not?*" Seventy two percent support this resolution whereas only 14% believe it is not right. The remaining 14% of the respondents gave no response.

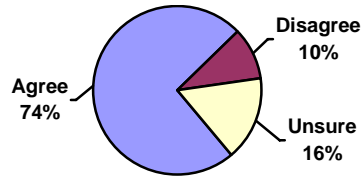

In a follow up question the respondents were asked "*Members of Punjab assembly believe that due to these late night packages the youth was turning towards immoral and unethical activities. Do you agree with them or not?*" Seventy four percent (74%) said they agree, 10% said they disagree, whereas 16% of the respondents were unsure.

The study was released by Gilani foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2761 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during February 2010. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
