Public Pulse in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (2025): Governance, Gaps, and Growing Discontent

An Analytical Review of Public Satisfaction Across Key Development and Governance Metrics

Based on a representative face-to-face survey of 3,000 residents with a 2–3% margin of error at 95% confidence, this 2025 report reveals a province at a crossroads. While certain initiatives have gained public appreciation, deep dissatisfaction with service delivery, governance performance, and corruption dominates the sentiment—cutting across political affiliations and regions.

1. Access to Basic Services: Uneven Progress with Stark Regional Disparities

- Access to clean drinking water (74%) and education facilities (74%) was relatively high, but healthcare availability was lower at 63%, with nearly four in ten rural residents lacking access.
- Gas (33%), parks (21%), and libraries (15%) were among the least available services.
- Hazara Division outperformed other regions across most indicators, while **South KP** and rural areas lagged substantially.



2. Governance and Development: Public Confidence Declines Under the New PTI Government

- During PTI's 13-year rule, 59% acknowledged road improvement, 53% transport development, and 50% general development efforts.
- However, since the 2024 elections, only 43% observe road work, 37% transport improvements, and 40% general development—even PTI voters report diminished development activity.
- 55% of KP residents say the current government has not launched infrastructure programs that benefit the general public.

3. Corruption and Accountability: Strong Public Demand for Transparency and Investigations

- 52% of residents believe development funds were wasted due to corruption; only 32% think they were spent properly.
- 48% see rising corruption in government departments; even 42% of PTI voters agree.
- 71% support investigations into past corruption, including 62% who believe former PTI ministers were involved in mega project corruption.
- The demand for better accountability crosses party lines, reflecting widespread public frustration.



4. Economic Governance: Employment Opportunities and Programs Failing to Inspire Confidence

- 59% of respondents believe unemployment has risen in the past year, and 67% say the government has taken no concrete action to address it.
- Most people are unaware of major economic programs like BizHub and BKPAP—awareness levels hover below 50%.
- 73% of residents think personal connections outweigh merit in government recruitment, painting a bleak picture of fairness in public hiring.

5. Security and Law Enforcement: Improved Policing but Persistent Fear of Terrorism

- While 58% rate security positively, 57% still fear terrorism, especially in South KP, where 72% report insecurity.
- **58**% are satisfied with police performance; however, concerns about **terrorism and law and order** remain deeply rooted.
- Political affiliations shape perceptions—PTI voters are more likely to express security satisfaction than opposition supporters.



but Support for Disabled Still Lags

- **54% have access** to the **Sehat Card**, and a nearuniversal 83% say it has improved healthcare access for the poor.
- Praise for the program cuts across party lines, marking it as a rare bipartisan success.
- Despite progress, 52% feel the disabled lack equal access to education and jobs, signaling systemic exclusion.

6. Social Welfare and Inclusion: Sehat Card Praised, 7. Local Governance: Clean Water and Health Score Well, but **Basic Municipal Services Lag**

- 58% are satisfied with local union councils; health and education delivery received 61% approval.
- Yet, dissatisfaction is widespread with waste management (49%), sewage (50%), and parks (49%).
- Public transport (41% dissatisfied) and road maintenance (40% dissatisfied) remain key complaints in urban and rural communities alike.



8. Judiciary and Justice System: Long Delays and Political Influence Undermine Trust

- 70% believe courts take too long to deliver justice.
- 50% perceive the judiciary as corrupt; 53% think it is politically influenced.

Support for traditional systems like **Jirgas** is high (84% among those aware), highlighting distrust in the formal legal process.

9. Youth Engagement: Political Inclusion High, but Economic Empowerment Needs Boost

- 69–70% believe youth are included in governance and decision-making.
- However, only 46–52% are satisfied with skills training and employment programs.
- Despite being politically engaged, the youth face limited support for entrepreneurship and job creation.



10. Political Leadership: Low Confidence in CM KP, Rising Favor for Punjab's Leadership

- 50% say CM Punjab outperforms CM KP. Only
 37% believe Ali Amin Gandapur is better than previous CMs.
- 47% want Imran Khan to replace CM Gandapur;
 even 36% of PTI voters agree.
- While public satisfaction is high in areas like health (64%) and education (62%), **corruption (53% dissatisfied)** and **infrastructure (43% dissatisfied)** remain weak points.

- 11. Refugee Management: Public Strongly Supports
 Deportation for Economic and Security Gains, contrary to
 what KP provincial government stance and action is
- 62% are satisfied with Afghan refugee management, and
 85% support the deportation policy.
- 79% believe deportation will enhance security, and 41% think Afghan refugees impacted local job availability.



12. Federal vs Provincial Performance: Desire for Cooperation, Distrust in Protest Politics (contrary to supported by large numbers **KP government actions)**

- **59% approve** of federal government performance overall, but only **36% trust either government** to reduce poverty or tackle corruption.
- 85% support federal-provincial cooperation, but 60% feel KP government wasted time in protests.
- Even among PTI voters, 48% disapprove of excessive sit-ins and demonstrations.

13. Social Media used but also doubted, regulation

74% distrust social media, and 80% support regulation or **censorship**, especially among educated and urban youth.

Conclusion

The KP Public Assessment reveals a dual reality: while certain programs like Sehat Card enjoy widespread appreciation, public trust in political leadership, accountability, and economic performance is eroding. There's visible frustration with development inequalities, weak institutions, and the perceived misuse of power. KP government will require responsive governance and equitable development to restore faith in the system and retain its vote bank.
























































Section 1 – Overall Public Satisfaction with Governance: The assessment shows a mixed picture with high access to facilities like clean drinking water (74%) and education facilities (74%) but glaring access with gas (33%), parks (21%) and libraries (15%). Although people acknowledge development work since 2013 in their area (59% road construction and improvement, 53% improvement of public transport, 50% other development projects) the majority including PTI voters feel limited to no work since this government assumed power in 2024 (54% road construction and improvement, 61%) improvement of public transport, 58% other development projects). Regional Disparity with CM KP own area (South KP) lagging in all indicators and Hazara Division coming at top on all access indicators.






2.2: Gauging Public Satisfaction with Public perception of corruption levels in government departments.











Q7. How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the performance of KP's anti-corruption institutions?











Q9. Some people believe that the PTI government in KP allocates public funds only to people close to the Chief Minister and top leadership. Others disagree. What is your opinion?











































KP residents give a poor report card on KP government: 59% feel unemployment has increased and 67% feel KP government has NOT created new employment opportunities. The KP government initiatives such KP Bizhub and others have very little awareness and resultantly the satisfaction rates (27% Bizhub, 25% BKPAP, 25% LACIP). When it comes to doing business, overwhelming numbers feel doing business is hard (63%) and it's easier in Punjab than in KP (59%). Again, on transparency issues like public funds spending and government jobs, poor public opinion results are visible (73%). On all these counts PTI voters' opinion is only marginally more positive than other party voters. 





























































































Generally speaking, KP residents give fair rating to both police (59%) and courts (53%). However, when prompted citizens express deep concern with respect to courts taking too much time (70% - prime charge), being manipulatable with respect to both money dissatisfaction (50% - corruption) as well as political influence (53%). There is therefore massive support for parallel judicial system of Jirga (84%) (though awareness remains low for jirga system (49%)). 































































Section 10 – Public Satisfaction with Political Leadership

When compared with CM Punjab, KP CM gets lower rating (50% CM Punjab vs 39% CM KP). However, in comparison with previous PTI CMs (Khattak and Khan), Gandapur is rated better (38% and 37% respectively). Despite having split public opinion with respect to his performance on tested 10 different yardsticks, more KP residents believe Gandapur should be replaced than those who feel he should not be replaced (47% vs 40%). CM Gandapur however retains trust of clear majority within PTI (53%). 47% rate CM PK performance as bad in cleaning and waste management, 47% rate bad on handling of economic challenges, 53% rate bad on reducing corruption in KP, and 47% rate bad on providing justice in KP.























































Section 12 – Public Satisfaction with Provincial vs Federal Government

The majority of KP residents are satisfied with the performance of the Federal Government (59%); 35% are dissatisfied. However, they feel that for most of the issues faced in KP by the population, the resolution lies with provincial government (44% trust provincial government to provide healthcare services, 43% educational facilities, 37% to resolve issues in their area, 36% providing employment opportunities, 35% strengthening anti-corruption measures, and 34% reducing poverty). Widespread support for KP government to cooperate with Federal Government (85%) and feeling that KP government wasted time in agitation (60%). The large majority recognize the ill effects of social media and support censoring SM (80%).




DETAILED NOTE ON METHODOLOGY:

Note on Sample Size

The sample size used in this survey is quite adequate even in comparison to international standards. Gallup US Daily poll is 500 and the Gallup Poll Social Series is 1000, both having track record of reliable predictability for USA (a country nearly 100 million larger in population of Pakistan). According to Five Thirty-Eight, one of the most credible sources on polling in the US: "Surveying 2,000 voters substantially reduces error compared with surveying 400 of them but surveying 10,000 voters will produce only marginal improvements in accuracy compared with the 2,000- person survey".

Obviously, choosing a higher confidence interval will give greater accuracy to the survey results, however, as the chart below shows, at a certain point the benefits of conducting more surveys begins to tail off:





DETAILED NOTE ON METHODOLOGY:

25 interviews have a confidence interval of 19.6 and 100 interviews has a confidence interval of 9.8, whilst it falls to 4.4 at 500 interviews and 3.1 at 1000 interviews. However, a further 1000 interviews only lower the confidence interval by 0.9 to 2.2. A confidence interval of 1 (not shown on the graph) would require a massive 9604 interviews.

Is a larger sample always better than a smaller sample?

Larger samples are generally more precise, but sometimes not. The important rule in sampling is not how many poll respondents are selected but, instead, how they are selected. A reliable sample selects poll respondents randomly or in a manner which ensures that everyone in the area being surveyed has a known chance of being selected.



DETAILED NOTE ON METHODOLOGY:

How do you interpret Error Margins?

How do you interpret a margin of error? Suppose you know that 51% of people sampled say that they plan to vote for Mr. X in the upcoming election. Now, projecting these results to the whole voting population, you would have to add and subtract the margin of error and give a range of possible results in order to have sufficient confidence that you're bridging the gap between your sample and the population. Supposing a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points, you would be pretty confident that between 48% (= 51% - 3%) and 54% (= 51% + 3%) of the population will vote for Mr. X in the election, based on the sample results. In this case, Mr. X may get slightly more or slightly less than the majority of votes and could either win or lose the election. This has become a familiar situation in recent years when the media want to report results on Election Night, but based on early exit polling results, the election is "too close to call."

What Error Margins do not mean:

The margin of error measures accuracy; it does not measure the amount of bias that may be present. Results that look numerically scientific and precise don't mean anything if they were collected in a biased way
